Leavers' fund




Thank you to all the families who left us in the summer of 2023 and generously donated to our leavers' fund, raising £1,030 in total. At the Day Nursery we have spent some of the funds on educational wooden toys for sorting and stacking as well as a wooden farm set. At the Nursery School we are planning to replace the playhouse in the back corner of the garden once the weather improves in the spring. A parent has recently made a temporary repair to its base, but after around 20 years of constant use, the house now needs replacing.

The leavers' funds were the brainchild of an ACE Parents' Committee member in July 2015 and since then have raised over £7,500 for the nurseries. Thank you to everyone who has contributed over the years.









We've had a huge amount of use out of the library at the Nursery School, which is located in what used to be the parents' room. This was funded entirely out of the proceeds of the July 2022 leavers' fund. It's a great place for small group work, talking to visitors, for staff to do online training, as well as the perfect place to read books of course! Maria - one of our staff members - has recently catalogued all the ACE books so we can find them easily.

alumni interviews




We've interviewed three alumni and/or their family members for this edition...

Our son Sami attended ACE Nursery just over a dozen years ago - he's now a strapping 15 year-old getting ready to take his GCSEs at The Perse! We arrived in Cambridge after an epic journey from Vancouver which we made without taking a plane - just trains, buses and boats - and quickly felt at home in the city. Although smaller, its vibrant diversity and abundance of green spaces made it seem the perfect place to raise young children.

ACE was a welcome first educational experience for Sami. We were struck by the warmth of the staff, the international makeup of the parent body and the happy, curious atmosphere enjoyed by the children. When did your child attend ACE?

Théo went to the Nursery from 2019 to 2021. He loved it from day one and we as a family got so much out of being part of the ACE community. I was so nervous about his first day at nursery, but I needn't have worried – as soon as he had been welcomed by Maria and saw all the toys he told me that I could go home!

What particular memories do you/does your child have of ACE?

The ACE garden made a lasting impression on Théo and he has lots of memories of playing with his friend Amalia in the houses and the mud kitchen. He also remembers singing lots of songs. We as a family are still fond of some of the books that we discovered through Théo's time at ACE, in particular Mr. Gumpy's Outing and Handa's Surprise. Théo often talks about Maria, who was his keyworker, in particular if he hears someone speaking Spanish! I am so appreciative of how rich his time at ACE was and how many opportunities he had for creative play – I loved reading the ACE update each week and finding out what new activities had been set up in each of the rooms!

Where is your child now? Where are you working now? What are you doing now?

At the end of Théo's second year at ACE, we moved to Fontainebleau, just outside Paris, for a five-year secondment. I was so sad that his younger brother Lucas missed out on the chance to be part of ACE too! School starts earlier in France and Théo joined in the last year of infant school, which was a big change for him. Fortunately, his school had some similarities to ACE – it also has a parent-run model and a child-led approach, which helped a lot with the transition. He has just finished his first year at primary school and says that it is quite different to ACE as there are not so many toys and the classes have the names of countries instead of birds. When we visit Cambridge, Théo is always keen to walk past ACE and he was so happy to have the chance to see Maria again earlier this year. He is also always excited to see Amalia, who was his great friend at ACE, and who he loves to keep in touch with through text messages and cards.
