# **ACE Nursery School & ACE Day Nursery**Newsletter



It's hard to believe we're already at the end of the school year. Our best wishes go to everyone who is moving on from ACE this summer and in September we look forward to welcoming back children who are entering their second year at ACE — they will be our "big girls and boys" who show the ropes to the new children and help to settle them in. Read on for news from both nurseries, including photos from the teddy bears' picnic in June which was a particular highlight of the term.





### Overview

Transitions have been a major theme of the term at both settings. At the Nursery School we have been visited by reception class teachers keen to get to know the children who will be moving to their school. Little ACE children moving up to Big ACE have been for settling in sessions at Parkside whilst Nursery School staff have been to the Day Nursery to get to know their new key children. Boys and girls from the outside waiting lists who are joining us in September have also been for visits. We're proud of the children moving on to new locations in the autumn and wish them all the very best. Do keep in touch – we would very much like to see "first day at school" photos please! Thank you to everyone for your wonderful cards, messages, gifts, cakes and donations to the ACE leavers' fund. £630 has been raised for the Big ACE fund, which is amazing and will buy resources for the children to enjoy next year. We've also been given an apple tree for the ACE garden by a family who are moving out of Cambridge and a hydrangea by another family. Thank you everyone.



The social highlight of the term was the Teddy Bears' Picnic – it was a perfect summer's day at Wandlebury and we enjoyed seeing many current and former ACE families in attendance. Over 40 parents helped us on the day, illustrating the ongoing strength of the ACE co-operative. Our sports day on Parker's Piece was also incredibly

well supported – thanks to all the family members who came along to join in the fun.





We've enjoyed many wonderful interactions with parents and grandparents this term: from organising visits to places like the local church, to coming in to read, bringing in fossils for the children to look at, playing musical instruments, cooking and running a charcoal drawing session. Thank you all.



### **Friendship Tree**

Friendship was one of our words of the week, which led to conversations about how to be a good friend, how to make friends and so on. We thought our handprints could be used as leaves on a friendship tree, so set about making one on a large piece of paper. As well as talking about how to make friends, we decided to actually make two friends by drawing round our bodies on paper,

cutting out the shape and then decorating them. We displayed our two friends either side of our friendship tree. This topic also linked well with many of the children transitioning to school and facilitated discussions about how they hope to stay in touch with ACE friends as well as meeting new ones.









During June we followed the '30 days of wild' initiative by the Wildlife Trust. They suggested a different wildlife activity each day. One of these was to "become a bee champion" so we learnt about why bees are important and how we can protect them. This led to us making a watering hole for bees, as they need water - especially on hot days. The children set to work with a block of clay.

### **Bees**

Another day was 'watch a wild webcam.' We carried on the bee theme and watched live coverage from a bee hive; we could hear the bees buzzing and the children asked to watch it several times as they were so fascinated by it. We learnt about different types of bees - including red tailed bumblebees - and how important the insects are for pollination, to help our plants and flowers grow.







### **Butterflies**

Continuing the insect theme, we learnt all about the life cycle of the butterfly. We took delivery of caterpillars in a container with special food and air holes, watching them grow and turn into chrysalides before eventually metamorphosing into butterflies. We fed the newly emerged butterflies fruit and nectar before releasing them in the back garden with all the children and staff watching on. One flew up and over the ACE building; it was a really magical moment. The children named the butterflies: Strawberry, Twinkle, Mr Shaya, Lemonry and Bally! We made our own giant butterfly painting to finish off the project.

The butterfly theme also dovetailed perfectly with transitions that are a feature of this term and our fly away song.









### **Bricklaying**

Just before the May half-term break, we were visited by Luca's grandfather who is an architect. That inspired us to build a 3D model of ACE that we reported on in our last newsletter. Following on from this, we thought it might be fun to try bricklaying.

Using sand, shaving foam and a little washing up liquid, we made our own mortar and then the children turned their hand to building a wall with wooden bricks.





### **Charcoal drawing**

We were delighted when Clara, Gabriel's mummy, offered to run a charcoal workshop in the garden on a beautiful summer's afternoon. She showed us a range of materials and talked about how they are made. We also looked at ancient wall drawings from the caves of Chauvet in South Western France. Then we experimented with willow charcoal, painted with a crushed charcoal/water mix and made marks with charcoal of different sizes and shapes.



After that we unrolled a long piece of paper to create a group drawing. There was room for every child to draw what they wanted, try their hand at a cave painting, or draw what they could see in the garden. Thank you very much, Clara, for an inspiring workshop.







### **Tea towels**

Another creative activity we enjoyed this term was designing our own Puffin and Penguin group tea towels, using the children's self-portraits.

We were delighted with the result and many families bought one to use at home or give as a gift.





### **Sports Day**

The sun came out at exactly the time we had planned to be on Parker's Piece for our sports day (only minutes after a heavy downpour!) We enjoyed lots of fun games, supported by a wonderful turnout of family members.

After all our exertions, we sat down for a slice of orange and a drink of water before heading back to ACE.









### **Overhead projector**

This was originally a STEM activity, but it blossomed into an open ended creative project, including story telling!

There was great excitement when the overhead projector came out, as we hadn't used it for quite a while. We started looking at light and shade, then placed loose parts on the projector and tried to anticipate where the shadow would appear. Much fun was had when the children realised that the image could also turn up on their tummies if they were stood in a particular position and lifted up their T shirts!

The giant shapes that were projected onto the wall inspired shadow puppetry as well as story telling. Diana led the way and made up a story about the objects, adding characters and some actions. The children were captivated and soon began to create their own wonderful tales. It's a great confidence building exercise too, recounting your story in front of the group.









### **Overview**

Now it's time to catch up on activities at ACE Day Nursery. In this edition, we'd like to update you about three items: role playing which led to a trip to a pet shop, our tea party to celebrate Father's Day and our exploration of numbers.

### Vet role play and pet shop visit

The girls and boys were showing lots of interest in animals so the staff decided to set up a vet surgery role play area. The children had access to doctors' equipment such as a stethoscope, bandages, thermometers and medical uniforms. The children looked after our animals (cuddly toys) so well, using gentle hands when putting bandages on their heads or checking their breathing. This led Carmen to plan a trip to the pet shop in the Beehive Centre. A few days later, Carmen, Gabi and Sarah took a group of six children to the shop. The children ate a snack of crackers, fruit and water on the grass before going in to see the animals.

All the boys and girls behaved superbly with good listening skills. They were excited to see so many animals, big and small, and talked about how some had lots of hair, many had tails and others were covered in scales.

On the way back to nursery, the group stopped at the St Matthew's Piece play area and explored some of the equipment, practising their climbing, swinging and balancing. After the trip, the children extended their interest in animals by finding out facts about sea life creatures.





















### **Father's Day Celebrations**

We held a tea party for fathers and grandfathers on 20<sup>th</sup> June. Bably organised a lovely afternoon with a big group of daddies and grandfathers turning up at the Little ACE yellow door. All of the children had been involved in preparing for the afternoon, by making medals containing their photo and a special message for their daddy. The children also helped make a delicious pizza in the morning, using homemade tomato sauce, red peppers, olives and cheese.

From 4pm our garden was full of daddies and grandads playing with their children or grandchildren. The girls and boys rode bikes, played football, explored playdough and had their photos taken with their family member using a frame that was specially made for the event. We finished off the afternoon with pizza and ice cream for tea.

























#### **Numbers**

In the last few weeks the children have shown a lot of interest in numbers. We've enjoyed counting out pompoms to the number shown on a piece of paper, using tweezers to pick up the items (which helps with hand co-ordination). Number games with pegs have also been popular, with the boys and girls becoming very comfortable when it comes to matching the



number of pegs needed to make five, as shown in the photo below. Lining up number cubes in order is another good skill that the children have been demonstrating recently. At group times we've been singing number nursery rhymes like "one two three four five, once I caught a fish alive..." as well as counting out loudly!





### **Teddy Bears' Picnic**

The main social event of the summer term took place on the afternoon of Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> June at Wandlebury Country Park. We invited current and former ACE families and it was wonderful to see so many in attendance on a perfect summer's day. Former Headteacher - Paula - and Deputy Head - Sally - were there, as well as Sarah P (Day Nursery manager who is on maternity leave). The event was brilliantly organised by Becca, Gilbert's mummy (thank you

so much!) with Julia (Rebecca's mummy) at the helm of the clean-up operation. It was an amazing team effort with more than 40 parents helping out in advance or on the day, from buying prizes for the best dressed teddy competition, to designing labels for the strawberry pots, to making a giant bubble wand and face-painting. 
